
SAY:

- > Designate one person from each group to report answers to me.

<u>Instructions for Teacher</u>

- \checkmark Kids must read everything carefully in order to complete the tasks.
- ✓ As groups come to you for answer checks, give them their next activity pages (if the last challenge is correct). Go from left to right. Also, hand out one of the final plot line puzzles at the end of each task completion, making sure all 7 have been handed out by the time they finish the 4 tasks. You will hand out the last 4 plot line puzzle pages after the last task has been completed. They can be handed out in any order.
- \checkmark After groups finish the Escape, hand out the exit slips and the awards.
- \checkmark If time allows, debrief the Escape challenge. Exit slips are great for leading the debriefing.





Then one evening, they discovered a strange young man admiring Snow White's lovely face through the glass. After listening to the story, the Prince (for he was a prince!) made a suggestion.



Eventually, Prince Florian and Snow White fell in love and got married and moved into the grand castle. The dwarfs were frequent guests, and they all lived happily ever after.




















Exposition

Mama took them to Hollywood. She left them with a nasty, pushy producer who got them a job on Real Kids of Fairytale County. They lived in a fancy mansion with an entire pantry full of Skinny Mint cookies, but they were still homesick.

Hansel had an idea. He took a selfie in front of the pantry full of Skinny Mints and he posted the picture on Fakebook, where he knew his stepfather would see it. As expected, the very next day the wicked stepfather was at their door, demanding cookies.

The sequence of events that builds suspense.






The problem or struggle between two opposing forces.
